More To Benefit From Laudium Community Fun Walk 2016

The exponential growth of the Annual Laudium Community Fun Walk since it started in 2013 will result in even more needy people being assisted this winter.

The 4th edition of the Walk on Sunday 29 May saw more than 3 000 supporters from all over Gauteng and even some from neighbouring provinces packing out the Rosina Sedibane Sport Stadium as many of them took on the streets of Laudium in the 7km walk.

Even the weather played along beautifully after severe storms forced the postponement of the event from its originally planned date of a fortnight ago.

Young and old as well as families, some even with toddlers and babies in prams, participated in the walk, thereby ensuring more funds for buying blankets and food parcels for underprivileged families and orphans living in shelters on the streets around the City of Tshwane.

Supporters and family members who waited at the stadium for the walkers' return had a host of entertainment and education facilities to keep them busy, from displays of exotic animals to food stalls offering items to suit all palates.

The main attraction this year, besides the Fun Walk, was the very popular Bounce INC from Midrand, that constructed an enormous outdoor trampoline park.

This year the early morning activities were focused on educating and entertaining the whole family, but specifically targeted the younger generation to raise awareness of charity in addressing the plight of the homeless and hungry and the importance of reaching out to the underprivileged in their time of need.

Experts were also on hand giving advice on how to maintain an active healthy lifestyle and educating children about wildlife and nature conservation
