

Adapt IT opens Knowledge Centre in Olievenhoutbosch

The Knowledge Centre at Steve Tshwete Secondary School will serve as a fully equipped computer lab with laptops, a printer, Smartboard and connectivity for use by the 990 learners and 33 educators.
