KZN, MANXILI – 29 AUGUST 2015: The Tobeka Madiba Zuma Foundation

The clinic which was unveiled by President Zuma and the three stakeholders comprises of an integrated TB and HIV clinic referred to as the Wellness Centre and the Primary Health Care, is situated in the deep rural KwaZulu Natal.

The 13 500 people from the community of Manxili, braved the cold weather to go and receive their clinic.
