"Our young engineers have recently participated in a winter school programme in the Free State earlier this month, where they offered extra tuition in Mathematics and Physical Science to Grade 12 learners," Ntshepe says.

The Career Day will not only encourage high school learners to continue with their studies in STEM subjects, but also create a greater awareness about career opportunities within the defence and technology sectors. Denel annually offers bursaries and internships to students at various tertiary institutions and trains artisans at the Denel Technical Academy in Kempton Park.
