Miners welcome budget statement

Surface mining association, Aspasa, has welcomed the Medium-Term Budget Policy Statement's (MTBPS) that aims to contain expenditure and implement meaningful reforms aimed at achieving sustainable and inclusive economic growth.

Aspasa director, Nico Pienaar, says the economy is going through a particularly challenging time and the association welcomes Government's initiatives to contain expenditure and contain costs without putting additional strain on the country's economic framework. "We understand that difficult choices need to be made in order to put the country back on the road to prosperity and remain committed to assisting Government in its endeavours to do so.
