Durban chemical manufacturers accelerate transformation and support small business

The Business Accelerator provides intensive mentorship and coaching and affordable financing solutions to fast track high potential small businesses' success. Launched in December 2018, the programme has trained twenty-five small businesses with seven receiving mentorship and coaching over the course of this year.

DCC Chair of the Skills and Transformation Programme, and CEO of Thebe Unico Honey Manobolo stated "Initiatives such as this are great platforms for bringing entrepreneurs, small businesses and funders together for synergistic opportunities to be identified and advanced".
